- B. Sensory bins/tables
 - 1. Freeze toys in ice cube trays. Use eye droppers with warm water to free the animals.
 - 2. Ooblick: Equal Parts of cornstarch and water.

- C. Playdough recipe
[2 cups flour, 1 cup salt, 2 tsp alum, 2 Tbs oil, 2 cups boiling water]
